Thankfully, those thoughts are quick and fleeting when I see people opening MAP email updates (and sending excited responses with exclamation points!), when we receive unexpected items to meet clients' needs at our office, when a consulting firm decides to help us develop our board and strategic roadmap, or when we double our end of the year fundraising goal because so many people believe in our mission. These actions, large and small, add up and carry MAP's mission to overflowing. All of these things, as my son would say, "fill my bucket" every day!

Can I just say, from the bottom of my heart, I am so so thankful to not be doing this alone?! Thank you for joining me in this journey to advocate for healthy families, *one mom at a time*! I hope you are encouraged by the accomplishments that WE made together this year and recognize that YOUR sacrifice to support this work has multiplied its impact into the valuable lives of these mothers and children! Wow! What a year!!





Family Preservation and Reunification

Our programs consist of a seven month, three phase intervention for the primary caregiver, to enable either family preservation or family reunification.

This is a bio-psycho-social model that consists of three phases of trauma recovery:

I. INITIATIVE
II. PROGRESSIVE
III. RESTORATIVE

Each phase targets a specific outcome, including resetting of the central nervous system, processing trauma, and trauma assimilation. The participants of the program have individualized MAP care plans and move through the three phases based on their treatment progress and clinical assessments results. The core trauma-intervention and case management are coupled with additional services, based on the individual needs of each client, such as court advocacy, referrals to specialized services, assistance with food, clothing, and shelter. This additional support, along with childcare and transportation to appointments, is provided at different levels and intensity as the participants move through the program.

acey was introduced to MAP in 2019 by a friend in her church who was trying to help her and her family. She loved her children and was working countless hours at a restaurant, but finding herself constantly overwhelmed with the pressures and realities of life. Macey had tried therapy before, but it never worked.

Although she knew she needed help, she feared that MAP would be another program to give her a diagnosis and meds, only to make her feel worse about herself. Add these fears

in the midst of her hard life situation and the rigid work hours, and she was not able to join the program.

She, honestly, just hoped that she could simply work harder to get her family out of the situation they were in and be better.

However, 2 years later, she found herself in a different job and different scenarios, but still the same obstacles and challenges. She recognized that if she didn't get help for herself, she could never help her children and have the family she dreamed of. She re-applied and was accepted in 2021.

Throughout her time at MAP she began to recognize that her situation was not just "a bad set of circumstances," but was something she could take control of.

She learned to see life from a different perspective. She began counting the positive aspects of her life and saw the places she wanted to change as opportunities for her to do just that, take back her life and make change.

She felt empowered by the knowledge she gained of what really was happening in her brain because of trauma and that she could actually do something to heal herself from the inside out.

Throughout her 7 months at MAP, she addressed her own personal needs and challenges, she set structure and boundaries for herself, her kids and her family. When asked, she said, "How was I supposed to be there for my kids, when I didn't even know how to take care of myself?"

She wanted to be a good mom. She wanted a family that was stable and healthy and communicated well. But, she didn't know where to start. MAP not only gave her a place to start, but also the stepping stones to achieve her goal.

Macey said, "To me, MAP is helping you find something like navigation. It's like 911 to a mom. This is the place that when you're having issues you know you can go to without feeling judged."

As an alumni of the program, she admits that it doesn't mean her life is perfect, but she now has the tools to continue her growth!

Macey is currently engaged to be married, and is living with 2 of her children. She has regained a relationship with her 3rd child, a teenage son who had been in foster care since he was young. What a joy it is to be in his life, to be able to offer advice, guidance, and support to him... a relationship that once felt lost.

Macey told us that she was grateful for the opportunity to learn how to heal herself and has told several friends to come too and get the help they need!







1984. 84 OUT OF 100. MAP:84 CAMPAIGN

he year is 1984. Cyndi Lauper, Whitney Houston, Prince, and Tina Turner are playing in your walkman, as you cruise the streets wearing acidwashed jeans or spandex! A movie ticket is \$2.50 and your monthly rent is only \$350! For many, the 80s were a simpler time, and life was neon!

But for 84% of children in foster care, life is not so simple or bright.

Did you know that 84 out of 100 children are in Georgia foster care, for solvable problems? These solvable problems exist because of intergenerational cycles of poverty and trauma.

Over the last 5 years, Mothers Advocacy Project has worked hard to prevent families from separation. This work is called *Family Preservation*. I am thrilled that we have been very successful! However, there are still children in foster care waiting to go home and mommas counting the days their babies have been gone.

Therefore, as we grow our reach and test the

adaptability of our model, we will be opening up a new track to reunify these families. This work is called *Reunification Readiness*.

In keeping with the theme, I would be remiss to not mention George Orwell's novel, 1984. It's been years since I have read this dystopian social science fiction novel, so let me refresh your memory, too. In the world Orwell creates, he paints a vivid picture of life as it should never be: trapped, controlled, and where "big brother is always watching you." He refers to these watchdogs as the societal beasts.

Poverty and the foster care system itself can feel much like this dystopian society. Once a family is involved with DFCS (Division of Family and Children Services), it is hard to get out. This is why over 1/2 of foster children stay in the system for 2+ years. While in foster care, both the child's and parent's lives are watched, documented, and analyzed. Decisions are made for individuals and families by people who don't even know them (at least at first). And because of the trauma they have already

endured, the pressure of this system creates a numbing fear, paralyzing families from moving forward. The foster system today is not working and no one will argue with that... not even DFCS. I believe that MAP is perfectly positioned to step in. We want to see families healed and know that the cycle of intergenerational trauma must be broken first so we can replace it with a renewed cycle of family stability. With this true and lasting intervention, we hope to see systemic changes impacting generations to come.

We asked our donors, "Would you help us to disrupt the dystopian reality of 28 families (84 children) in foster care, so we can ensure that family separation is not the solution to their family's struggle?"

Our goal was to raise \$84,672 to work with 28 families, which crazy enough, would be an estimated 84 children. I am excited to say that our MAP:family well exceeded our goal and raised \$152,287.




